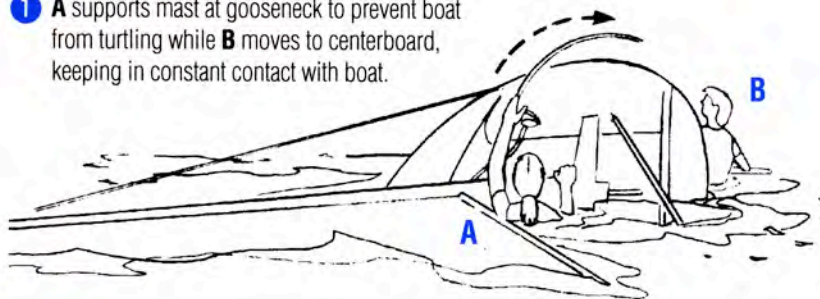


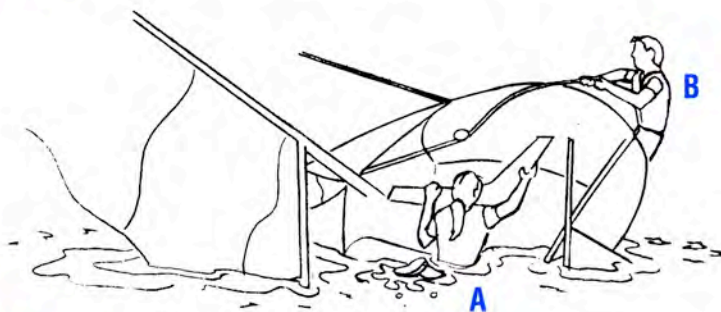
Scoop Recovery Method

The *scoop capsized recovery* is the best righting method for boats that are sailed by two or more people. As the boat rights, a person is “scooped” into the boat, and this person can then balance the boat when it is back upright and place it in the safety position. This person can also help the other person into the boat. It’s important that the sailors keep in constant touch with each other during the capsized recovery.

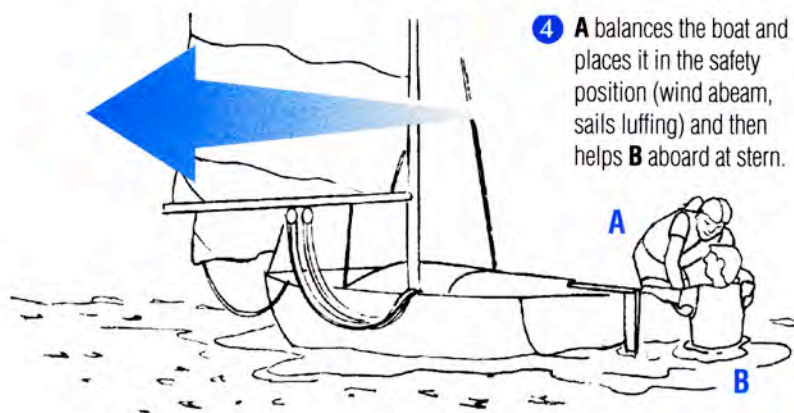
- 1 **A** supports mast at gooseneck to prevent boat from turtling while **B** moves to centerboard, keeping in constant contact with boat.



- 2 **A** frees the main sheet and throws a jib sheet over the side of the boat. **B** climbs on centerboard, using jib sheet as a safety and righting line.



- 3 **B** leans out on centerboard while **A** holds onto stationary object in cockpit and kicks. As boat swings upright, **A** is “scooped” into cockpit.



- 4 **A** balances the boat and places it in the safety position (wind abeam, sails luffing) and then helps **B** aboard at stern.
